

CRITERIA FOR THE MARTIN COUNTY 4-H ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Martin County 4-H Scholarship Committee met on November 9, 1992. The following criteria was decided upon and accepted unanimously on February 8, 1993 by the Martin County 4-H Association*, with revisions agreed upon in December 2014.

- 1) The scholarship applicant must be active in the Martin County 4-H program as a member for three consecutive years. Active participation as a club officer or a letter of recommendation from their club leader is required.**
- 2) They must be in good standing with the 4-H program.**
- 3) The scholarship can be used for room/board, tuition and books.**
- 4) The 4-H applicant can receive only one 4-H scholarship.**
- 5) This scholarship has a one-year (from date of award) availability.**
- 6) The 4-H applicant can apply in their senior year of high school OR their freshman year in college.**
- 7) The scholarship committee will consist of members from the 4-H Association Board and 4-H Leaders.**
- 8) An interview may be required at the committee's discretion.**
- 9) The 4-H applicant's total 4-H record will be taken into consideration. This includes: camps, conferences, state programs, workshops, community involvement, club participation, and District, County and State events.**
- 10) This scholarship is to be used for higher education ONLY, this includes technical schools.**
- 11) The youth must be a graduating high school student earning a diploma or has obtained a GED.**

The youth will NOT be penalized for:

- a) School averages - it was by consensus of the Martin County 4-H Association that if a child is accepted into college or a technical school and is willing to work, they are deserving of any applicable assistance.**
- b) Applicants will not be penalized for participating in any 4-H projects that receive monetary awards or premiums.**

The scholarship will be dispersed in two payments; 50% will be deposited to the student's college account upon acceptance, the remaining balance will be deposited after the student completes one semester, sending transcripts to the Martin County 4-H Association showing a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher.
